

Port Credit doctor named general secretary of CMA

Dr. J. Douglas Wallace of 1408 Crescent Rd., Port Credit has been appointed general secretary of the Canadian Medical Association.

Dr. Wallace will assume the responsibilities of the chief executive of the 20,000 physician member association in late September and will take up residence in Ottawa this fall where CMA headquarters are located.

Currently the executive director of the Toronto General Hospital, Dr. Wallace held a similar position at the University of Alberta Hospital in Alberta from 1961-1966.

Announcing the appointment at a press conference in Toronto, CMA President Dr. D. L. Kippen said:

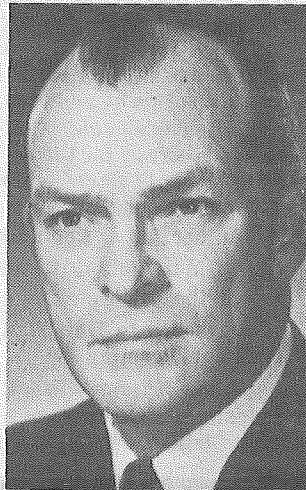

Born in Lumsden, Saskatchewan, Dr. Wallace received his medical training at the University of Al-

berta in Edmonton. Following service in the RCAF Medical Service during World War II he was engaged in private practice for 13 years in his home town of Wainwright, Alberta. His first administrative position was as director of the Alberta Hospital Plan from 1959 to 1961.

ACTIVE WORKER

Dr. Wallace has been active in both hospital and medical voluntary affairs. He is a fellow of the American College of Hospital Administrators and has been an active member of the CMA, the College of Family Physicians of Canada and other medical and hospital organizations for several years.

In 1969, Dr. Wallace served as chairman of the Federal-Provincial Cost of Health Services Task Force on Salaries and Wages. He is currently the president of the Ontario Council of Administrators of Teaching Hospitals and is a past president of the Association of Canadian Teaching Hospitals. He is a member of the Manpower Committee of the Ontario Council of Health and a member of the Executive of both the Metropolitan Toronto Hospital and Hospital Planning Councils.
