John Wood, still glittering from his bright silver moment at the XXI Olympiad in Montreal, came home Monday evening to an enthusiastic reception at the Mississauga Canoe Club (MCC).

was given an honorary life membership to the club.



"When we realize that he's (Wood) the second best in the whole world, it's fantastic," beamed Mayor Dobkin.
