Doctors Woolfe, Turpin, to appear

Dr. C. G. Woolfe of Erindale, who became ill while working with Project Concern in Hong Kong, will be honored Nov. 21 by Erin-

dale residents.

Project Concern is an independent non-profit medical relief program with a deep concern for humanity.

Over 440 doctors, dentists, nurses, pharmacists and other volunteers representing 34 nations are involved.

Dr. Woolfe was working on a medical boat in Hong Kong harbor when he became ill and after several weeks in hospital returned to Canada. He has been convalescing since his return.

Dr. James Turpin, who established Project Concern in Hong Kong, and has worked in Vietnam, will speak at the Erindale meeting.

Dr. Woolfe was inspired to join Project Concern

after he heard a broadcast speech delivered by Dr. Turpin.

There are four outpatient clinics in Hong Kong. One serves the Walled City of Kowloon where more than 25,000 persons live in a 10-square block area of poverty. There is no running water or sewage system.

Project Concern's floating clinic serves Chinese refugees who are too superstitious to set foot on land.

The movement began in Hong Kong in 1962.

Everyone is invited to attend the meeting.
