Jan Gehl

Jan Gehl is an Architect who has devoted much of his career to researching, teaching, and consulting on public space, public life, and the creation of lively, diverse, and safe cities and neighbourhoods. The founding partner of Gehl Architects, Jan is also Professor Emeritus of Urban Design at the School of Architecture, at the Royal Danish Academy of Fine Arts in Copenhagen.

Jan's international teaching includes visiting professorships in Edinburgh, Toronto, Calgary, Melbourne, Perth, Berkeley, San José, Oslo, Dresden, Wroclaw, Hanover, Guadalajara, Vilnius, Cape Town and Costa Rica, and his consulting practice is similarly broad based.

Jan has been awarded the Sir Patrick Abercrombie prize for exemplary contributions to town planning by the International Union of Architects and, in 2006, was awarded an international honorary fellowship to the Royal Institute of British Architects (Int. FRIBA).

Jan's publications include New City Life (2006), New City Spaces (2001), Public Spaces Public Life (1998), and his seminal work, Life Between Buildings - Using Public Space (1971), which has been published in 15 languages.



Ken Greenberg

As Former Director of Urban Design and Architecture for the City of Toronto, Architect and Urban Designer Ken Greenberg, Principal of Greenberg Consultants has played a leading role on a broad range of assignments in highly diverse urban settings.

Much of Ken's work has focused on the rejuvenation of downtowns, waterfronts and neighborhoods, campus master planning, regional growth management, and new community planning in his own city Toronto and in such cities as Amsterdam, Paris, New York, Boston Montreal and San Juan, Puerto Rico.

His projects include the awardwinning Saint Paul on the Mississippi Development Framework, the Brooklyn Bridge Park on the East River in New York, the East River waterfront in Lower Manhattan, the Fan Pier in Boston, and the Southwest and Southeast Waterfronts in Washington, D.C

Ken is a Fellow of the Royal Canadian Institute of Architects, the Toronto Society of Architects and the Institute for Urban Design. His work has garnered awards from the Canadian Institute of Planners, Progressive Architecture, the City of Toronto, the Canadian Architect and the American Planning Association.
