THINKING BIG ABOUT MISSISSAUGA



The Visioning Symposium is a moment in the Our Future Mississauga process at which Participants will collaboratively Think Big about the future of our city. The outcomes of this process will directly shape the conversation at upcoming events, as well as the development of the City's new Strategic Plan.

As a Participant, you have been asked to Think Big, but what is Big Thinking?

- Big thinking is about the big picture bringing together people with a variety of backgrounds, experience, and expertise, to work collaboratively developing long-term holistic strategies to address complex and interconnected issues.
- Big thinking is transformative Big thinking leads to positive and effective change. Transformative thinking is cyclic a change in attitude and in perspectives leads to a change in strategic direction that should then encourage more transformative thinking.
- Big thinking is impactful Big thinking does not implicitly mean big budget. It is not about the size of the project, but the impact. Subtle strategies can have ripple effects that are long-lasting and transformative.
- Big thinking is achievable Big thinking is not an exercise in blue sky dreaming. Big thinking is about developing strategies that are financially, technically, and politically feasible. Big Thinking leverages existing assets and strengths in building a framework of creative and relevant strategies that address specific issues.
- Big thinking is strategic Big thinking is focussed and responsive, and it must have a clear rationale and purpose. The Strategies developed through this process should respond to the current context and to anticipated future conditions, and should guide the City toward specific desired objectives.




PROJECT BACKGROUND

Our Future Mississauga is about actively engaging the people of Mississauga in a conversation about the future direction of their City. It is about participating in a process of dreaming big and generating fresh ideas that will culminate in the creation of a new Strategic Plan for the City of Mississauga.

To facilitate this process, the City of Mississauga retained Officefor Urbanism, a Planning and Consulting firm based in Toronto, to create a public engagement strategy that would inspire Mississaugans to dream big and to create together with the City of Mississauga a new long-term Strategic Plan.

The process began in August of 2007 and should reach completion by the fall of 2008. To date, research into the planning and policy context ("Reconnaissance phase"), and the Speaker Series have taken place ("Inspiration phase"). The Speaker Series was the kick-off to the public engagement strategy. Prominent, knowledgeable, and motivational speakers such as Stephen Lewis, Justin Trudeau, Glen Murray, and Dr. Roberta Bondar were invited to speak to nearly 1000 Mississaugans on each of four different nights.
