
The City's website is becoming easier to use

A sneak preview of Saigon Park

Located along Matheson Blvd. West, Saigon Park will provide recreation opportunities for the enjoyment of residents and employees of nearby businesses and serve as a stormwater management facility through the pond in its centre.

The name "Saigon" recognizes the Vietnamese-Canadian community who found refuge in Canada when they were forced to flee Vietnam during the Fall of Saigon in April 1975.



Park features include:

- Naturalized plantings to support stormwater management and natural heritage;
- A 1-km trail with fitness stations;
- Various lookout points including a pier and;
- A public art piece entitled "A Year in Weather".

An official opening event is planned for Spring 2020.

Register for the Driveway Windrow Snow Clearing Program

Registration for the City's Driveway Windrow Snow Clearing Program is open until 9 p.m. on November 8 for residents 65 years and over and people



with physical disabilities. The program provides assistance to eligible applicants by clearing a space in the windrow (about three metres or 10 feet wide) after snow plowing operations have ended. The program runs from December 2, 2019 to March 27, 2020.

Animal Services is in the community every day responding to emergencies involving abandoned and lost pets. Donations made to the SCARF program (Special Care for Animals and Resources Fund) assist with the financial burden of caring for critically injured pets that need lifesaving surgeries. SCARF also supports the foster care program for orphaned kittens and pregnant cats, the

spay/neuter program and shelter enrichment such as the new cat portals. These portals greatly reduce the stress levels of shelter cats keeping them both happy and healthy.

Putting Mississauga on the tourist map

Known as a vibrant and beautiful world class city to live, work and play, Mississauga is in the midst of an exciting endeavor to also develop and promote the city as a place to visit. In April 2019, City of Mississauga Council endorsed the Tourism Master Plan, including a five-year Implementation Plan



to guide the development of Mississauga as a tourism destination. The Implementation Plan has been structured to lead and develop Mississauga tourism products, planning and promotion through 25 tactics. With the implementation of the Municipal Accommodation Tax in 2018, funding is now accessible to support the Plan and other tourism-related initiatives.

Mississauga's SMRTCTY Master Plan focuses on using technology to support an enhanced quality of life and be future-ready. Mississauga is already a Smart City, with over 150 digital services, connected infrastructure and digital programs, from Library services to small business digital support. We provide free public Wi-Fi in 95 City locations, a Virtual Campus used by over one million students in its first year and an Advanced Traffic Management System to improve traffic flow. Over the next ten years, the SMRTCTY Master Plan will build on this foundation. We will explore new ways to work alongside residents to continue to create a dynamic and inclusive city – A Smart City for Everybody.

Transportation Master Plan

Our first Transportation Master Plan sets a vision that "in Mississauga, everyone and everything will have the freedom to move safely, easily and efficiently to anywhere at any time."

The Plan includes six goals and over 90 action items to guide the future of the City's transportation system from today to 2041. The Plan advances the City's commitment to Vision Zero, by laying out a strategy to strive for no loss of life on roads in Mississauga.

The Plan is future-focused and comes at an important time in the City's development. Actions will be built into work plans through the annual Budget process. Progress on the actions of the Plan will be tracked and reported annually.

Change is Coming to Central Library

Mississauga Central Library is preparing for a major interior renovation, with construction anticipated to begin in early 2021.



The project will transform Central Library into a place of endless possibilities. The renovation will create flexible study, learning and working spaces that are user-focused, modern and accessible to the Library's more than 800,000 yearly visitors. Renovations will enhance the library with new and interactive technology, making it easier to access digital collections and services and support digital literacy development. New program, technology and service offerings will help meet the needs of our growing and changing community.
