#### THE MAYOR & MEMBERS OF COUNCIL:

Resolution 0045-2017, adopted unanimously on March 29th, included the following:

'That a complete review of by-laws governing our taxi industry be immediately conducted with an eye to eliminating or modifying all or every by-law or regulation to parallel those in the regulations for the Pilot Project governing TNCs starting July 1, 2017; and

The results of that review be presented in a report to Council in sufficient time to amend or remove all regulations and by-laws that are more restrictive than those being proposed for the TNC Pilot Project for a period of 18 months commencing July 1, 2017, and running parallel to the Pilot Project.'

Since its inauguration in June, 1974, the PVAC has advised Council on all matters pertaining to the taxi industry, particularly regarding Public Vehicle Licensing By-law 420-04, as amended, and those By-laws which preceded it. Given the wholesale review about to be undertaken by Staff aimed at eliminating many longstanding regulations designed to promote consumer health, safety and protection, in the strongest possible language, I urge you to provide members of the general public and the taxi industry with a chance to comment on any proposed changes via the PVAC, and, at the same time, afford members of the PVAC the opportunity to frame recommendations for your consideration, based, in part, on that input.

Resolution 0045-2017 portents the likelihood of major changes. Given the PVAC is the most desirable venue for the free exchange of ideas on taxi-related matters, and has been since its inception, directing proposed By-law amendments to the Committee to enable a comprehensive review would be greatly appreciated.

#### RECOMMENDATION

DATE:

That By-law 14-2003 to regulate the smoking of tobacco in public places and workplaces within the Region of Peel be repealed;

And further, that the Regional Clerk request that The Corporation of the City of Mississauga, The Corporation of the City of Brampton and The Corporation of the Town of Caledon rescind their resolutions consenting to the passing of By-law 14-2003.

#### REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

- Regional Council enacted By-law 14-2003 on May 22, 2003 to regulate the smoking of tobacco in public places and workplaces within the Region of Peel.
- The Smoke-free Ontario Act came into effect in 2006 and regulates the smoking of tobacco in public places and workplaces throughout the province of Ontario, including the Region of Peel.
- Since the *Smoke-free Ontario Act* is now well-established and regulates the smoking of tobacco in public places and workplaces, By-law 14-2003 is redundant and can now be repealed.

#### DISCUSSION

# 1. Background

Regional Council enacted By-law 14-2003 on May 22, 2003, from the report entitled "Regional Smoke-Free By-law Public Consultation" to regulate the smoking of tobacco in public places and workplaces in the Region of Peel. At that time, there was no other legislation in place serving that objective. The by-law was passed by Regional Council (and consented to by the local municipalities) on the advice of the Medical Officer of Health to address concerns around the risk of adverse health effects arising from exposure to second-hand smoke among Regional residents and workers.

# REPEALING BY-LAW 14-2003 TO REGULATE THE SMOKING OF TOBACCO IN PUBLIC PLACES AND WORKPLACES WITHIN THE MUNICIPALITY

## CONCLUSION

The specifications of By-law 14-2003 have been superseded by amended provisions within the provincial *Smoke-Free Ontario Act*, making the by-law redundant for its purpose. Given this, it is recommended that By-law 14-2003 be repealed per the process described in this report.

#### BY-LAW NUMBER 15-2017

## A by-law to repeal by-law 14-2003

WHEREAS, the Council of The Regional Municipality of Peel enacted Bylaw 14-2003 on May 22, 2003, as amended, to regulate the smoking of tobacco in public places and workplaces within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS, the *Smoke-Free Ontario Act*, S.O. 1994, c. 10, as amended, now regulates the smoking of tobacco in public places and workplaces within the municipality;

AND WHEREAS, the lower-tier municipalities The Corporation of the City of Mississauga, The Corporation of the City of Brampton and The Corporation of the Town of Caledon provided their consents by resolution to the passing of Bylaw 14-2003 pursuant to clause 115(5) of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25:

AND WHEREAS, in order to repeal By-law 14-2003, the lower-tier municipalities of Mississauga, Brampton and Caledon must rescind their consent to the passing of By-law 14-2003 pursuant to clause 115(6) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25;

AND WHEREAS, the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25 provides that if there is a conflict between a provision of any Act and a provision of a by-law passed by a municipality under section 115 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, the provision that is the most restrictive of the smoking of tobacco prevails;

AND WHEREAS, the Council of The Regional Municipality of Peel wishes to repeal By-law 14-2003;

NOW THEREFORE, the Council of the Regional Corporation enacts as follows:

- 1. That By-law 14-2003 is hereby repealed.
- 2. That this by-law comes into full force and effect as soon after enactment as:
  - (1) a majority of the lower-tier municipalities of Mississauga, Brampton and Caledon rescind their resolutions giving consent to the by-law pursuant to clause 115(5)(b) of the *Municipal Act*, 2001, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended, and
  - the total number of electors in the lower-tier municipalities that have rescinded resolutions form a majority of all electors in the Regional Municipality of Peel.
