

Whereas Hazel McCallion has been a champion of many charitable and non-profit groups including those preserving Heritage and supporting the Arts;

Whereas the attached letter from Hazel McCallion – a Patron of the Riverwood Conservancy – has endorsed The Riverwood Conservancy as a charity that will raise funds in recognition of her 100th birthday celebrations;
