- 7.1. Introduction of New Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee Members (5 Minutes)

Newly appointed Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee members: Ewelina Luczko, Leonard Verwey, Richard Dubiel provided brief introductions of themselves.

7.2. Community Ride Update (Donnie Morris, Citizen Member)

Donnie Morris, Citizen Member provided background information on the history of the rides and noted that the GTAA just confirmed that they would not be funding the 2017 Community Rides.

Members of the Committee engaged in discussion regarding sponsorship opportunities and the location of the kickoff ride. Councillor Fonseca noted that she would bring a Notice of Motion to the next Council meeting requesting the \$8000.00 for the program

and that the finalization of routes would be deferred to the next Network and Technical Subcommittee meeting.

7.3. Phil Green Award (Communications and Promotions Subcommittee 10minutes)

Dorothy Tomiuk, Citizen Member spoke to the nomination process, timelines and the media release for the Phil Green Award. Members of the Committee expressed support of the publication for the media release.

7.4. 2017 & 2018 Proposed Construction (Ben Gomberg, Manager, Active Transportation 15 minutes)

Mr. Gomberg spoke to proposed construction projects led by the Transportation and Works department. He outlined the following infrastructure projects: Meadowvale GO Station; Burnhamthorpe Trail; and Courtney Park Drive. He indicated that the proposed construction projects are around 20km – 25km in length and that 6.5million dollars had been allocated.

7.5. Tour de Mississauga Update (Jelmer Stegink, Marketing Consultant and Donnie Morris, Citizen Member 20 minutes)

Donnie Morris, Citizen Member provided background information on the Tour de Mississauga and noted that the Board of Directors of SustainMobility did not support SustainMobility operating the 2017 Tour de Mississauga.

Jelmer Stegink, Marketing Consultant outlined a new model for the 2017 Tour de Mississauga. He outlined the event concept to include: shorter distance routes; registration fees; post ride food; and a working relationship between SustainMonility and the City of Mississauga.

Dorothy Tomiuk, Citizen Member spoke to: previous efforts made by the City of Mississauga to follow a 3rd party model; risk management; rebranding the Tour de Mississauga and spoke to concerns with the delay of the Cycling Master Plan.

Members of the Mississauga Cycling Advisory Committee engaged in discussion regarding: route distances; Community Ride distances; next steps and if the Tour de Mississauga should continue or be incorporated into a Community Ride.
