Michael Cleland, Acting Director, Environment spoke on the City of Mississauga's Climate Change Action Plan noting that it will be approximately 2 years to complete, and stated that Julius Lindsay, Community Energy Specialist, will in his presentation explain the approach to the project, proposing areas of focus, community engagement, and gathering feedback on how the Environmental Action Committee can get involved.

Julius Lindsay, Community Energy Specialist, spoke to the City of Mississauga's Climate Change Action Plan, and brief summarized the two pathways to action that being Mitigation and Adaption, the objectives and goals for the development of a comprehensive plan for the City of Mississauga.

Mr. Lindsay provided an overview of the phases, outcomes and timelines for the developing of the Climate Change Action Plan, noting that the written and final approval of the plan is anticipated for the late quarter of 2018 to the early quarter of 2019.

Mr. Lindsay further provided an overview of the following:

- gap analysis;
- studies to be conducted;
- project structure; internal and external;
- Environmental Action Committees role: Participation and engagement; stakeholder committee oversight and planed studies to be conducted; and presentation to Council.

Mr. Lindsay would like to see Members of the Environmental Action Committee participate in engagement events, subcommittees and other groups formed through the development of the Climate Action Plan.

Mr. Lindsay asked Members of the Environmental Action Committee to share their thoughts and ideas on the presentation.

Councillor Matt Mahoney, thanked Julius for his presentation and noted that it is great to see that Members of the Environmental Action Plan are being formally included and more involved in the development of the City of Mississauga's Climate Action Plan.

Pujita Verma, Peel Environmental Youth Alliance, suggested that there be representation from a youth group.

Eashan Karnikk, University of Toronto, Mississauga Representative, inquired about the City's participation with Partners for Climate Protection. Mr. Lindsay advised that the City has been participating for a number of years and it is an ongoing participation.

Joanne Deidun-Roork, The Little Green Schoolhouse Representative, suggested looking at various wards in Mississauga and having a family community organization involved in environmental events.

Credit River Tributary Erosion Control – Credit Valley Golf and Country Club 2012 - 2013

Project Overview

A Municipal Class Environmental Assessment (EA) study conducted by the City of Mississauga in 2012 identified two areas on the Credit Valley Golf and Country Club (CVGCC) property where erosion had created risks to valley slope stability. The first study area was along the tributary which conveys stormwater into the Credit River Valley adjacent to the CVGCC clubhouse, located at 2500 Old Carriage Road.

The second study area was along the valley of the main branch of the Credit River adjacent to Ostler Court. Both areas have actively used lands bordering the top of the Credit River valley system where erosion could create the potential for collapse of the valley walls.

After consulting with local stakeholders, the City decided to rebuild the most critical sections to a stable slope in the first study area (tributary), and monitor, inspect and assess the second study area (the valley wall) annually until 2021. The objective of the works is to prevent the risk of valley wall failure created by erosion to protect adjacent property and minimize the impacts to surrounding terrestrial habitat and downstream fish habitat.

Benefits

Funding

The total cost of the Credit River Tributary Erosion Control work including the planning, design and construction phases totalled approximately \$808,000. CVGCC shared the cost of this project, while the remainder was largely funded by municipal taxes.
