# 5.1 <u>Sami Bukhari, MYAC and Avilia (Ayce) Yovarda with respect to Rebel 16 May 1-7,</u> 2016.

Mr. Bukhari spoke to Rebel Week and introduced Mr. Yovarda for a performance.

Members of Committee commented on the performance by Mr. Yovarda and invited him to open mic night at the Living Arts Centre and to perform on Canada Day in Malton.

In response to a question from Councillor Saito, Mr. Bukhari advised that majority of the events for Rebel Week would take place at the Clarkson Community Centre.

#### 5.2. Item 7.2 Chris Schafer, Uber Public Policy Manager – Canada

Mr. Schafer referred to a staff report that was considered by the Public Vehicle Advisory Committee and spoke to the Transportation Network Companies (TNC) regulations. He requested that Committee not support the recommendation coming from PVAC as it would stop ridesharing. Councillor Starr spoke to the matter and noted that there should be fees paid to the

government by TNCs and the importance of protection for residents.

# 5.3 Karam Punian, Taxi Driver

Mr. Punian expressed concerns with the operation of TNCs. He noted that they are violating the law, not paying taxes and the effects of ride sharing on the taxi industry.

#### 5.4 Baljit Pandori, Taxicab Brokerages

# 6. <u>MATTERS CONSIDERED</u>

### 6.1. <u>Parking Prohibition and Three Hour Parking Limit Exemption – Glen Erin Drive (Ward 9)</u>

#### RECOMMENDATION

That a by-law be enacted to amend The Traffic By-law 555-00, as amended:

- 1. To implement a parking prohibition anytime on both sides of Glen Erin Drive between Bell Harbour Drive/Peacock Drive and Britannia Road West;
- 2. To remove the three hour parking limit exemption for a maximum of eight hours between 8:15 a.m. and 4:15 p.m., Monday to Friday on the west side of Glen Erin Drive between a point 100 metres (328 feet) south of Quail's Run and a point 85 metres (279 feet) southerly thereof.

 That a by-law be enacted authorizing the permanent closure of part of Arvona Place described as: In the City of Mississauga, Municipality of Peel, Province of Ontario and being composed of Part of Blocks 548 and 549, Registered Plan 43M-1357, described as Parts 1 and 2, Plan 43R-24333, previously established as public highway by City of Mississauga By-Law 0264-2000, in the report entitled A By-law to Close Part of Arvona Place, dated March 28, 2016, from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works, and that City staff be authorized to register the by-law on title against the subject lands in the appropriate land registry office.

2. That following Council's approval to close a portion of Arvona Place, as described in the report dated March 28, 2016, from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works, that the Commissioner of Transportation and Works and the City Clerk be authorized to grant, execute and deliver such easements and rights as are necessary to preserve and protect the interests of public utilities with respect to the placement and maintenance of utilities within such closed public highway or parts thereof.

6.4. <u>To Authorize a By-law to restrict vehicular passage along a portion of Second Line West</u> from Sombrero Way to Donway Drive (Ward 11)

# RECOMMENDATION

That the report dated April 6, 2016 from the Commissioner of Transportation and Works regarding the proposed vehicle restriction of Second Line West from Sombrero Way to Donway Drive be approved in accordance with the following:

- 1. That a by-law be enacted to restrict access and travel along a portion of Second Line West from Sombrero Way to Donway Drive, save and except for access or travel by pedestrians, cyclists, emergency service vehicles, motor vehicles used by public utility companies or service providers related to the repair, installation or maintenance of the subject lands described as part of Lot 9, Concession 2, West of Hurontario Street and part of the Original Road Allowance between Concessions 2 and 3, West of Hurontario Street, designated as Part 1, Plan 43R-36449 and Part 1, Plan 43R-36806, notwithstanding the above, the registered owner of the property municipally known as 6611 Second Line West (including all guests) may continue to enjoy vehicular access over and along that portion of Second Line West situated between the driveway to the said property and Sombrero Way, only until such time as the said property is redeveloped and access to an alternate public highway is established by the City of Mississauga in conjunction with such redevelopment.
- That a by-law be enacted to change the name of a portion of Second Line West described as being part of the original road allowance between Concessions 2 and 3, West of Hurontario Street, designated as Part 2 on Plan 43R-36806 to Donway Drive.

3. That City staff be authorized to register the by-laws on title against the affected parcels in the appropriate Land Registry Office.

#### 8. <u>COUNCILLORS' ENQUIRIES</u>

Councillor McFadden enquired about the removal of illegal signs. Ed Sajecki, Commissioner, Planning and Building explained that students would be hired to enforce the Sign By-law during the Spring and Summer seasons.

Councillor McFadden noted that there was a survey to households about Mississauga separating from the Region of Peel and who they voted for in the last election. Janice Baker, City Manager and CAO noted that she was not aware of it and that it was not initiated by the City.

Councillor Kovac requested staff to look into including more youth performances at Council. Ms. Baker noted that Community Services staff and the City Clerk could look into the matter.

Councillor Starr spoke to a possible park dedication in memory of Ron Lenyk in Ward 6. He noted that he would like to work with Community Services staff regarding this matter.

Councillor Starr expressed concern with the costs associated with driveway related issues at the Committee of Adjustment and requested information on the costs. Mary Ellen Bench, City Solicitor noted that staff would report back on the information on the history of matters that were brought forward by the Enforcement Division. She clarified that the City uses paralegals for these matters to keep the costs lower. Ms. Baker noted that the By-law could be changed, but it won't stop issues from arising. Councillor Saito expressed that she was pleased that the City does have controls for driveways because there are some situations that are concerning. She noted that the Committee of Adjustment fees for small things are too high and that she may raise the issue again during the budget process.

Councillor Saito requested staff to follow up on a response from the Province with respect to a recommendation from the Accessibility Advisory Committee to request the Province to allow Accessibility Advisory Committee members to attend meetings by conference call due to some of the physical complications that may occur.

Councillor Saito enquired about the advance notice required to request to light up the tower. Gary Kent, Commissioner, Corporate Services and Chief Financial Officer advised that approximately 2 weeks is needed although there isn't a standard in place yet. Councillor Saito advised that she received a request for lighting up the tower for June 2<sup>nd</sup> to observe World Eating Disorders Action Day.

Councillor Fonseca noted that she received a request from Roy Hyson with respect to naming an outdoor rink in Ward 3 in memory of Ron Lenyk. She noted that she could speak further with staff regarding this.

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Councillor Fonseca noted that the Special Olympics flag would be stopping in Mississauga on May 9<sup>th</sup> -15<sup>th</sup> and enquired if the flag could be raised at the Burnhamthorpe Community Centre on May 9<sup>th</sup> and could speak to staff regarding this.

Councillor Tovey enquired about flag raisings in the Mississauga Celebration Square. Mr. Kent advised that the Diversity and Inclusion Advisory Committee would be considering a report regarding this matter at their next meeting. Councillor Tovey requested that staff get back to him about flag raisings as he received a request regarding an aboriginal flag raising.

Councillor Tovey enquired about the lack of Council members sitting on the Art Gallery of Mississauga's Board. Paul Mitcham, Commissioner, Community Services advised that he would have to review the history of the organization. It may be an issue that could be discussed with the Executive Director. Councillor Kovac noted that he would be interested in sitting on the AGM Board. Following discussion to appoint a member of Council to the Board, Ms. Baker expressed concern about an appointment to AGM's Board prior to discussion with the Executive Director.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That if the Art Gallery of Mississauga (AGM) indicates that they will accept a Member of Council to be a member on the AGM Board, that Councillor Kovac be appointed to the AGM Board for the term of Council for a term of office to November 30, 2018 or until a successor is appointed.

Councillor Parrish advised that she would be providing a series of questions to the Enforcement Division with respect to towing.
