- 7.1. Building on Success Mid-Point Report on the City's Economic Development Strategy

Ms. Amring, Mr. Dremin, Ms. H. Brown and Ms. B. Brown spoke to the mid-point of the Economic Development Strategy to note the highlights and future opportunities.

- 7.2. Hurontario Light Rail Transit Project Update: LRT Stop Hierarchy

Joe Perrotta, Director, LRT Project Office noted that staff are looking for Committee's endorsement of the LRT stop hierarchy as we move through the next planning phase with Metrolinx.

Mr. Bell spoke to the LRT and the stop hierarchy and noted the linkages with Inspiration Lakeview and Port Credit and Master Plans. Mr. Bell explained the role of the transit stop, design approach, stop categories and criteria. He presented the LRT stop hierarchy and the next steps.

Members of Committee spoke to the matter and noted support for the LRT stop hierarchy, it would invite new ridership, the stops would be landmarks and that they should be practical stops.

In response to questions from Committee, Mr. Perrotta noted that the costs for the stops is still yet to be determined and explained that it would come down to what the industry responds with to the specifications in the procurement. Ms. Baker further explained the procurement process for the transit stops and noted it would be different from the usual prescriptive procurement process.

#### 10. COUNCILLORS' ENQUIRIES

Councillor lannicca explained the need for land for the future such as community centres, LRT, transit nodes, parking authority etc. Direction was given to staff to bring forward a report for the upcoming budget cycle or in Spring 2017 on strategic land acquisitions.

Councillor Saito enquired about the Animal Licensing Fees and noted that seniors are given a discount for the fee, but not to people with disabilities or low income. She noted that the same discount should be offered to people with disabilities or low income. She requested that staff bring a report forward with respect to the matter.

Councillor Saito noted that residents can access their tax account and print it out but Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) requires that the statement show that it's paid. She requested that staff review the online service to show that the tax account is paid and bring it to Budget Committee. Gary Kent, Commissioner, Chief Financial Officer noted that staff could review it. Janice Baker, City Manager and CAO agreed that staff could review the matter to make it CRA compliant. Councillor Fonseca enquired about the LED streetlighting program on Tomken Road, Bloor Street, Rathburn Road and within neighbourhoods as there are streetlights that do not turn off. She requested an update on when the lights would be converted to the LED lamps.

Councillor Fonseca enquired about a policy with Hydro for the cutting of grass in the hydro corridor. Geoff Wright, Commissioner, Transportation and Works noted that staff would follow up with Hydro. Councillor Fonseca noted that the situation is specifically behind Audobon Blvd.

Councillor Fonseca enquired about Enersource and how they prioritize to neighbourhoods as there are some power outages with streetlighting in the Applewood Hills area. Ms. Baker explained that this is exclusively an Enersource issue.

Councillor Parrish requested that staff look at what the City of Toronto is proposing for their Animal Care By-law and report back on what Mississauga should include in their Animal Care and Control By-law. Mr. Wright confirmed that staff would review the report for any differences in Mississauga's By-law.

Mayor Crombie referred to the last mile and connections to GO Transit and the BRT. Mr. Wright noted that the ability for walking, cycling and car sharing play a big role in terms of the last mile. He noted it is an ongoing effort to work on transit, an active transportation program, cycling program and working with EDO in terms of working with businesses.

Councillor Mahoney enquired if rooming houses are legal and how the regulations are enforced. Ed Sajecki, Commissioner, Planning and Building explained that rooming houses are legal; however there are many that are operating illegally. Mary Ellen Bench, City Solicitor noted that for access a warrant is needed or it needs to be voluntary. It is difficult for enforcement because it is complaint based. Councillor Mahoney referred to a specific situation and Ms. Bench noted that more information for Fire Services and Building would be needed and staff could meet with the Councillor to discuss further.

Councillor McFadden enquired if Fire Services could go to the suspected illegal rooming houses for the Home Safe Home inspections. Tim Beckett, Fire Chief advised that the better way would be for members of Council to provide him with the addresses to be forwarded to Fire Prevention to send an inspector to gain access to the home. Mayor Crombie spoke further to the issue of rooming houses. She suggested that staff could review the best practices and how other communities deal with this and report back.

Councillor Saito announced that Mississauga won 3 Crime Prevention Awards at the Crime Prevention Symposium in Denver, Colorado. She further announced that Mississauga would be hosting the International Symposium and requested that Mayor Crombie send a congratulatory letter to the 3 recipients.
