5.1. Traffic Safety Council Draft Minutes – September 25, 2019

5.2. Site Inspection Report - Corpus Christi Catholic Elementary School (Ward 4)

Site Inspection Report for the site inspection and GAP study conducted on October 8, 2019 at the intersection of Lions Gate and Tea Garden Circle for the students attending Corpus Christi Catholic Elementary School.

Councillor Kovac enquired about where the site inspection request came from. Sheelagh Duffin, Supervisor, Crossing Guards advised that the request came from a resident. Ms. Duffin noted that 3 members of Traffic Safety Council were present at the site inspection and that students were crossing the intersection safely.

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the warrants have not been met for the placement of a school crossing guard at the intersection of Lions Gate and Tea Garden Circle for the students attending Corpus Christi Catholic Elementary School.
2. That the Principal of Corpus Christi Catholic Elementary School be requested to remind parents and students to cross Lions Gate with the Crossing Guard at Lions Gate and Elora Drive.

Sheelagh Duffin, Supervisor, Crossing Guards advised the Committee that the Ward Councillor noted concerns regarding the signal timing at the intersection. Louise Goegan, Citizen Member noted that students were well behaved and did not note issues with the signal timing during the site inspection. Committee Members discussed concerns with students jaywalking on Winston Churchill Boulevard. Committee Members agreed that a campaign to provide awareness of jaywalking in the area should be discussed and that the Traffic Safety Council (TSC) Representative on the Road Safety Committee (RSC) should bring this concern to RSC to come up with potential campaigns strategies. Committee Members also agreed that the Members of Council who sit on TSC should bring forward this concern at the next Council meeting.

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Principals of Edenwood Middle School and Meadowvale Secondary School be requested to remind their students to walk bikes and scooters, always press the pedestrian button and walk on the walk signal, not when it is flashing or solid.
2. That the Principal of Edenwood Middle School and Meadowvale Secondary School be requested to contact Peel Regional Police to talk to students in regards jaywalking in the area.
3. That Sushil Kumra, Traffic Safety Council Representative, Road Safety Committee, be requested to bring this issue of jaywalking to the next Road Safety Committee meeting to discuss possible solutions and campaign strategies.

Colin Patterson, Supervisor, Road Safety advised that additional speed management resources were required in order to achieve operating speeds, which were consistent with newly implemented lower speed limits throughout the City. Committee Members noted support for the coordinated implementation of the decrease in neighbourhood area, school zone and community safety zone speed limits.

That Traffic Safety Council supports the coordinated implementation of 40 km/h Neighbourhood Area Speed Limits, 30 km/h school zone speed limits, and Community Safety Zones within the City of Mississauga.
